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Introduction

Most of us at one time or another have had a relative or a friend that went to a doctor only to come home with a bad report. Cancer, heart disease, diabetes, etc. Diseases like these are strangling much of the world today. And while the Bible declares from cover to cover God's divine will and provision for healing to all that call upon Him, most of His people still suffer sickness and many end up dying prematurely from some disease.

Then there are those that have received a healing from the Lord yet they struggle with lack and in some cases poverty. And again the Bible declares from cover to cover God's divine will and provision for material blessings, yet many are still financially strapped and bound.

Worst of all many believe that it is God's will for them to be sick or suffer lack. Or they try to rationalize that God is trying to teach them how to suffer in some dignified manner even though the scriptures proclaim a message of healing and prosperity for God's people.

So if the Bible teaches us that it is God's will to heal and bless His people then why are so many of His people sick and/or suffering lack when God has promised health and financial blessings to them in the scriptures?

I had to ask God this question where my own life was concerned. I seemed to have strong faith in certain areas and yet I struggled when it came to other areas such as receiving healing. I had suffered with physical problems in my body and I needed a breakthrough but it always seemed to be a little further than I was able to reach. I needed to figure out where I was missing the mark.

Now I would like to share with you my own experience that brought about my need to ask God this question where my own life was concerned. My troubles started when I was eight years old, a car hit me while I was riding a bicycle. It was really my fault but nevertheless I was thrown from the bike and hit the curb headfirst. I broke my jaw on both sides and had my mouth wired shut for many months. I recovered and went on with life. But when I was seventeen, about a year after I had accepted Jesus, I began at times to experience strange smells in my nose and I found myself grabbing onto the arms of chairs that I sat in until

these strange sensations subsided. A couple of times I was told by friends that I had completely blacked out.

Within a couple of weeks my grandmother took me to see a doctor. In the process of time I came to find that I had been diagnosed with partial complex epileptic seizures.

This really turned my life upside down. My heart sunk as the doctor told me that for the rest of my life I would have to take medication to prevent seizures. One day I was a healthy person, the next day I was ball and chained to what at the time seemed like an endless prescription.

Initially, I was given a medicine called Dilatin and within six months I began having side effects from this medicine. The main side effect that I experienced was called Dilatin Hyperplasia. This is a condition that caused my gums to become swollen and tender. For example, if I ate anything with citric acid I would feel a very uncomfortable burning sensation in my mouth around my gums.

However, one day I went to a small Bible study with my grandparents and about six other people. We had just finished eating lunch and I had topped

my lunch off with some ambrosia fruit salad that someone had brought. While I was sitting there my mouth started burning from the citrus fruit in the salad but nobody at the Bible study knew I was in pain. Then all of a sudden the leader of the Bible study grabbed her mouth and said: “Somebody here is experiencing pain in his or her mouth and the Lord wants to heal you.” I was stunned! I spoke up and told the leader that I was the one experiencing the pain. Then everyone stretched his or her hands toward me and prayed, that day my mouth was instantly and completely healed. This was the first time I had ever experienced a healing touch from God. But the story doesn’t end there, about eight years later the problem started to come back again.

Even though I was very grateful to be healed from the pain that I had been experiencing in my mouth, I often pondered why God had only healed my mouth that day. I found myself wondering, why God did not heal the underlying root of my problem, which was the epilepsy. After all it was the epilepsy that required the medication that caused the pain in the first place.

I figured it had to be just as easy for God to heal epileptic seizures as it would be for Him to heal a

side effect caused by a medication. But many years later I realized that there was only one reason God did not completely heal me that day. Simply put, God wanted me to receive my healing by faith. He wanted me to learn to walk by faith for myself instead of simply handing me a miraculous healing on a platter. In other words, God wanted me to grow up and learn how to walk by faith instead of doing it for me through miraculous intervention.

I have found that at times the Lord will intervene and do special things on behalf of young believers in Christ that he will not do for more mature believers. When we were children our parents carried us in their arms but as we matured they expected us to learn to walk for ourselves.

Likewise God wants all of His children to learn how to walk by faith. God does not want us to put out a fleece or go searching for miracles; instead, God wants us to receive and possess His provision by faith in His Word alone.

Hebrews 10:38 Now the just shall live by faith; but if anyone draws back, my soul has no pleasure in him."

Hebrews 11:6 But without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must

believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him.

Ultimately, I ended up taking the prescribed Dilantin for about eight years before the side effects returned and became overwhelming. I then went to a different doctor who prescribed another medicine called Tegretol, which I took for another eleven years until the side effects from this medicine also became intolerable. The Tegretol caused stomach problems, excessive tiredness, and because my stomach was always upset I was popping antacids like candy which latter began to aggravate my kidneys.

After nearly twenty years of taking medicine and suffering a variety of side effects. I had finally had enough! I wanted, no actually, I needed a breakthrough. I had been a Christian for nearly twenty years and during all that time I had gone to three different Bible schools. I had listened to thousands of sermons, many on the subject of divine healing. Yet my health still seemed out of control, like a car on a steep hill with no breaks.

I simply needed a breakthrough and I wanted to get the results that God's Word promised that I could have. Even though I had been taught God's

Word concerning the promises of healing and faith for many years, I had never seemed to get a complete breakthrough. I had lots of ministers pray for me over the years but to no avail. I did not know where I was missing it but I was determined to get an answer. I knew that God's Word was true and I knew that He was no respecter of persons. The scriptures are full of accounts of people that were healed by God and I knew if God had healed them He was obligated by His Word to heal me. So I knew the problem was not on God's end I knew I was missing something but I did not know what it was.

Finally, I went to God in prayer to find out where I was missing it. While praying I asked God why I had not received a breakthrough in this area of my life. I also asked God why most Christians as a whole were not experiencing more breakthroughs in their lives. I did not get an immediate answer that day but a few days later I awoke in the morning and to my surprise I had dreamed a dream from the Lord and received the answer.

The dream was very strange in that I fell asleep while I was dreaming and then I dreamed a dream within the dream. This puzzled me until one day I

heard my pastor teach about Joseph and His interpretation of the Pharaoh's dream.

Genesis 41:32 "And the dream was repeated to Pharaoh twice because the thing is established by God, and God will shortly bring it to pass.

After hearing my pastor I realized that I had the dream within a dream because God wanted me to know that He was about to establish the message He gave me.

Now I am not going to go into all the details of the dream but I will say that I heard God speak to me in the dream and what he said surprised me. He said. "I want you to write three books and you shall name the books: 'Don't Panic,' 'Don't Give Up,' and 'Don't Listen to the Devils Lies.'" Then I awoke and told my wife that I had a dream from the Lord. Up to this point in my life I had never before had a dream from the Lord. But I also realized that this dream and its message was a direct answer to the prayer I had prayed only a few days earlier.

So when I had prayed and asked God why Christians, including myself, were not in many cases receiving their promised breakthroughs.

God's answer to me was. Write three books and call them: 'Don't Panic,' 'Don't Give Up,' and 'Don't Listen to the Devils Lies.' The book you are reading is one of these three books that God had instructed me to write. And I believe that the messages contained in these books are God's divine answer to receiving a breakthrough in any area of your life. I also recommend that you read all three books if you need a breakthrough along with my book "Faith that Honors God". And if you need a financial breakthrough I recommend reading my book "Honor the key to Prosperity".

By the way as I spent my time writing these books and followed the remedy that God gave me I am now completely healed and symptom and side effect free. I have also put these same principals to work on my financial matters and I can say with confidence that I am walking in great abundance and favor wherever I go. And just as God's remedy has worked for me it can also work for you!

Panic and Fear

Most of us at some time or another have had an experience with panic and fear. Our minds become bombarded with thoughts of the unknown and our bodies react in a verity of ways. Most of us have felt our heart rate climb up into our throat. But why do we panic and what causes fear to grip us?

The Bible actually addresses the subject of fear extensively, from cover to cover. Nevertheless I think the best place we can start is in the beginning.

In the beginning God created man and then placed him in the Garden of Eden. As we glean over the first references of man in the scriptures we find that originally man had no knowledge of fear. Adam and Eve spent their days tending the garden in a paradise full of peace. They walked with God in the cool of the day and enjoyed absolute fullness of life. But as we continue with the story we find that paradise was short lived.

Genesis 2:15

15 Then the LORD God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to tend and keep it.

16 And the LORD God commanded the man, saying, "Of every tree of the garden you may freely eat;

17 "but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall surely die."

God gave Adam clear direction and full knowledge about garden protocol. God told Adam what would happen if he disobeyed and ate from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. Unfortunately, as I am sure you may already know Adam and Eve disobeyed God and ate from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. This act of disobedience radically changed their lives and their perception of life, spiritually, mentally and physically.

Genesis 3:7-10

7 Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they knew that they were naked; and they sewed fig leaves together and made themselves coverings.

8 And they heard the sound of the LORD God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and

Adam and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God among the trees of the garden.

9 Then the LORD God called to Adam and said to him, "Where are you?"

10 So he said, "I heard Your voice in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; and I hid myself."

This is where it all started, this is the first account in the Bible of a person being afraid or fearful.

When Adam and Eve disobeyed God and ate the forbidden fruit they basically signed their own death certificates. Fear was never intended to be a part of the human experience but through this act of disobedience fear became part of the experience. So how did eating a piece of fruit bring about fear and death?

In short God told Adam and Eve that they would "die" if they ate the fruit from the forbidden tree. But actually the original Hebrew language takes it one step further and states that God said in "dying you shall die". Adam and Eve died spiritually as a result of this act of disobedience and ultimately the spiritual death that entered them brought about their physical death as well. But it did not stop

there, they also passed this death nature down to all their children and ultimately it found its way down to you and me.

One moment Adam and Eve were enjoying the fullness of life in the garden and the next they were hiding themselves in fear. Adam and Eve were originally clothed from the inside out with spiritual light and they had perfect fellowship, faith and confidence in and towards God, but after they sinned they found themselves naked and spiritually darkened, full of fear and afraid of God. So then we see that sin brought about spiritual death and spiritual death brought with it a spirit of fear.

Now we can see where fear came from but what exactly is fear? Fear is actually spiritual in nature. Fear is not an emotion although it can effect our emotions. In truth, fear is actually perverted or twisted faith. The best way to further explain this would be to look at the English word “wicked.” This word is derived from the root word “wick”, as in a “candlewick.” The root word “wick” means to twist as you would twist a candlewick or the way wicker furniture is twisted. So then, fear is really a wicked, twisted and perverted form of faith.

Fear could be defined as acting on and believing false, wicked or twisted evidence. FEAR = False Evidence Appearing Real.

Hebrews 11:1 Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen.

The Bible tells us that our faith gives substance to positive expectations (things hoped for) and it is the evidence of things not seen or perceived by our physical senses. Similarly, fear gives substance to negative expectations and it is the evidence of things not seen or perceived by our physical senses.

Panic on the other hand is simply a reaction to fear. Or we could say panic is acting on fear believed. Whether faith or fear we act on what we truly believe.

If you study the book of Job you will quickly come to realize that Job went through a rough patch of distressing trouble. However, God was not the source of Job's troubles, as many suppose. Rather God had to allow and permit what Job allowed and permitted. And unfortunately, Job was the one that opened the door to all his troubles. Through fear

Job unknowingly allowed the devil to come in and steal, kill and destroy everything in his life. Take a look at what Job had to say.

Job 3:25-26

25 For the thing I greatly feared has come upon me, and what I dreaded has happened to me.

26 I am not at ease, nor am I quiet; I have no rest, for trouble comes."

The ONLY reason that God allowed Job to go through what he did was because Job allowed it. Job's fear actually brought the devil onto the scene and at the same time Job tied God's helping hands.

Such is the case in our own lives, it is our faith or fear that will either allow God to help us or tie His hands of provision. Whether we operate in faith or fear is entirely our choice. That's right we can choose to believe or we can choose to worry but in the end we will believe something and that is what is going to chart our course and shape our destiny.

Keep in mind that God is not holding out on us any more than He was holding out on Job. He has already made provision for our every need whether physical or financial but it is up to us to reach out by faith and believe that what He said is true and

receive it. Even in the life of Job, after he repented and prayed for His friends God restored everything the devil had destroyed.

Job 42:10 And the LORD restored Job's losses when he prayed for his friends. Indeed the LORD gave Job twice as much as he had before.

It is important that we understand how fear can effect our lives. Many times people blame God for what the devil or wicked men have done. But these same people fail to realize that they allowed the enemy to have a foothold either through fear or some disobedience or sin. Remember that God only permits what we permit because he has given each of us the ability and right to choose.

So we can see how important it is that we do not allow fear to develop in our hearts. In order to see our breakthrough we must learn how to feed our faith and starve our doubts and fears. But whether we have faith or fear has everything to do with where we place our focus and attention. In fact, faith and fear actually grow and develop in the same way.

Romans 10:17 So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.

Just as faith comes by hearing so fear also comes by hearing. Faith in God comes from hearing God's Word. Faith in any person comes from hearing their words. Faith can also come from hearing a report. Fear on the other hand comes from hearing words inspired by the devil. Fear can also come from hearing a negative report. Nevertheless, all fear can be traced back to the Devil as its origin.

Knowing that fear comes through hearing, we need to be careful about what we allow into our heart on a regular basis. Even if we hear a negative report that is contrary to the known will of God, we have the choice to accept or reject it. If we allow ourselves to accept fear and let it go unchecked it will not only corrupt our faith but it can even develop into panic and open doors that can leave us vulnerable to attacks from the devil.

Faith grows stronger and stronger with meditation and fear grows stronger and stronger through negative meditation also known as worry. Every time we confess or recite our problems fearful expectations grow. Until our problems can get so

big that they consume and steal our lives. But if we will instead learn to confess and recite God's promises our faith and expectancy in God and His Word will grow.

Overcoming Fear

If you or someone you know just received a bad report from a doctor or you just encountered an unexpected financial problem. I have good news for you. You are in the perfect position to look to God. And God delights in showing Himself strong on behalf of those that choose to believe His report. Just because you received a bad report does not mean you have to accept it. Dare to believe God in spite of what your circumstances may be saying.

The scriptures are full of examples of people that found themselves suddenly thrust into horrible circumstances that could have devoured them had they allowed themselves to be moved by their circumstances.

For instance think about the account of Daniel in the lion's den. No doubt, Daniel most likely heard about people being tossed into the lion's den, seeing that he was a leader in the civil government of Persia at the time. In fact, Daniel may have even been an eyewitness to several executions himself. Nevertheless when several leaders in the Persian

government attempted to entrap Daniel and have him thrown into the lion's den. Daniel did not allow the situation to create fear within him, instead he entrusted himself to the Lord and kept his focus on God's protection and saving power. You can read the complete story about Daniel and the lion's den in Daniel, Chapter 6.

Daniel 6:23 Then the king was exceedingly glad for him, and commanded that they should take Daniel up out of the den. So Daniel was taken up out of the den, and no injury whatever was found on him, because he believed [had faith] in his God.

As bad as this lion's den experience must have been, Daniel never doubted God's ability to deliver him. Daniel honored God and God honored him.

Now if being cast into a den of lions is not bad enough how about a little fire. Daniel had three other companions that also were plotted against many years before during the Babylonian reign of King Nebuchadnezzar. Daniel's three companions were Shadrach, Meshach, and Abed-Nego.

King Nebuchadnezzar had setup a golden idol and had commanded everyone to worship the idol

when his orchestra played. However these three men refused to worship the idol under any circumstances. The king was extremely angry when he heard this report, consequently the king commanded that these three men should be cast alive into a burning fiery furnace. In fact the king was so angry he even had the furnace heated up seven times hotter than normal. You can read the whole story in Daniel chapter 3.

Daniel 3:22-29

22 Therefore, because the king's command was urgent, and the furnace exceedingly hot, the flame of the fire killed those men who took up Shadrach, Meshach, and Abed-Nego.

23 And these three men, Shadrach, Meshach, and Abed-Nego, fell down bound into the midst of the burning fiery furnace.

24 Then King Nebuchadnezzar was astonished; and he rose in haste and spoke, saying to his counselors, "Did we not cast three men bound into the midst of the fire?" They answered and said to the king, "True, O king."

25 "Look!" he answered, "I see four men loose, walking in the midst of the fire; and they are not hurt, and the form of the fourth is like the Son of God."

26 Then Nebuchadnezzar went near the mouth of the burning fiery furnace and spoke, saying, "Shadrach, Meshach, and Abed-Nego, servants of the Most High God, come out, and come here." Then Shadrach, Meshach, and Abed-Nego came from the midst of the fire.

27 And the satraps, administrators, governors, and the king's counselors gathered together, and they saw these men on whose bodies the fire had no power; the hair of their head was not singed nor were their garments affected, and the smell of fire was not on them.

28 Nebuchadnezzar spoke, saying, "Blessed be the God of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abed-Nego, who sent His Angel and delivered His servants who trusted in Him, and they have frustrated the king's word, and yielded their bodies, that they should not serve nor worship any god except their own God!

29 "Therefore I make a decree that any people, nation, or language which speaks anything amiss against the God of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abed-Nego shall be cut in pieces, and their houses shall be made an ash heap; because there is no other God who can deliver like this."

Shadrach, Meshach, and Abed-Nego honored God and in the end God honored their faith plus God gave them a promotion.

It is obvious from these stories that these men were more concerned about honoring God and His Word than they were about saving their own lives. When we give ourselves entirely over to God ways and put ourselves in His hands then we will see the saving and delivering power of God working on our behalf.

I Jn 4:17-18

17 Herein is our love made perfect, that we may have boldness in the day of judgment: because as he is, so are we in this world.

18 There is no fear in love; but perfect love casteth out fear: because fear hath torment. He that feareth is not made perfect in love.

(KJV)

Fear Not - Only Believe

Upon examination of the Gospels and the ministry of Jesus there are several things that seem to stand out relative to the subject at hand. I find it particularly interesting what Jesus had to say about faith, fear, believing and unbelief.

In fact it is very interesting to see how many times Jesus marveled at a person's faith or lack thereof. There are also several accounts of people that had their faith broadsided.

There are basically three types of faith spoken of by Jesus. The first type of faith is "no faith" or "faithless." This type of faith questions the truth and validity of God's Word and questions His love and care for us. This type of faith also opens up the door to fear, which is the Devil's playground.

LUKE 8:22-25

22 Now it happened, on a certain day, that He got into a boat with His disciples. And He said to them, "Let us cross over to the other side of the lake." And they launched out.

23 But as they sailed He fell asleep. And a windstorm came down on the lake, and they were filling with water, and were in jeopardy.

24 And they came to Him and awoke Him, saying, "Master, Master, we are perishing!" Then He arose and rebuked the wind and the raging of the water. And they ceased, and there was a calm.

25 But He said to them, "Where is your faith?" And they were afraid, and marveled, saying to one another, "Who can this be? For He commands even the winds and water, and they obey Him!"

Jesus had spoke a Word to His disciples "Let us cross over to the other side of the lake." Then circumstances arose that challenged the authority of His Word. But the disciples did not stand on the authority of His Word but became fearful when they focused on their circumstances. In the same way many question God when their circumstances don't seem to be going the way they think they should or when things don't change overnight.

Now the second type of faith is "little faith." Although this type of faith does believe God, it tends to worry and focus on the problem more than on God's word.

MATTHEW 6:30-34

30 "Now if God so clothes the grass of the field, which today is, and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will He not much more clothe you, O you of little faith?

31 "Therefore do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?'

32 "For after all these things the Gentiles seek. For your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things.

33 "But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you.

34 "Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about its own things. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble.

The third type of faith is the kind we should all endeavor to have, "strong faith" or "great faith." Strong faith recognizes the authority of God's Word and accepts His Word as ultimate truth and final authority. Strong faith does not worry or focus on the circumstances, nor does it require physical evidence in order to believe. Strong faith doesn't have to have all the answers, it simply trusts and believes God's Word and then acts on it.

MATTHEW 8:5-10

5 Now when Jesus had entered Capernaum, a centurion came to Him, pleading with Him,

6 saying, "Lord, my servant is lying at home paralyzed, dreadfully tormented."

7 And Jesus said to him, "I will come and heal him."

8 The centurion answered and said, "Lord, I am not worthy that You should come under my roof. But only speak a word, and my servant will be healed.

9 "For I also am a man under authority, having soldiers under me. And I say to this one, 'Go,' and he goes; and to another, 'Come,' and he comes; and to my servant, 'Do this,' and he does it."

10 When Jesus heard it, He marveled, and said to those who followed, "Assuredly, I say to you, I have not found such great faith, not even in Israel!

This centurion understood that words carry authority. He did not need to see any evidence in order to believe. He believed that the Words of Jesus had authority to heal the sick. When we come to a place in our Christian walk where we are able to believe that God's Word is ultimate truth and the final authority, our days of weak faith will

be over. But we have to be willing to step out of the boat and take God at his Word. We have to come to a place where we truly decide to believe and act on what God said even if everything else seems to contradict it. We need to come to a place where we can enter into the rest of God's Word the same way we would sit back and rest in a comfortable chair, knowing that it will hold us up.

We can all get to a place where our faith can rest in the truth and authority of God's Word. The Children of Israel never entered into the rest of God because of their unbelief. When God delivered them from Egypt by the hand of Moses, they did not take God at His Word, thus they never entered into the Promise Land. It is only by acting on and believing what God has said that we can enter into the rest of God and receive what He has promised us in His Word. I'm not saying that as Christians we will arrive at this place of rest overnight. Faith comes by hearing the Word of God but it is still our choice to believe and act on it. If we allow God's Word to become planted in our hearts until we become fully persuaded it is only a matter of time until harvest.

I can certainly understand how the first time we ever approach God, His Word may seem much like

the word of a stranger. But that should not stop us from being willing to take Him at His Word. In fact, many times we take the word of complete strangers without hesitation. After all how many times have you asked a complete stranger for directions? As we walk with the Lord we will learn by experience that His Word and character are honorable and trustworthy. So do not allow your inexperience to stop you from giving God the same credibility you would give anyone else, even a complete stranger. Take a close look at the following Scripture?

HEBREWS 6:17-18

17 Thus God, determining to show more abundantly to the heirs of promise the immutability of His counsel, confirmed it by an oath,

18 that by two immutable things, in which it is impossible for God to lie, we might have strong consolation, who have fled for refuge to lay hold of the hope set before us.

Hebrews 6:18 clearly states to us that it is impossible for God to lie. I do not know about you, but I think that is something to shout about, we can have great faith, confidence and credibility in God's Word. We know that a stranger may lie to

us, our boss at work, or even our best friend may even lie to us. In fact, our own mother or father may break their word to us. Almighty God, on the other hand, will **NEVER** lie or break His Word! The only way we will experience for ourselves that God's Word is true and faithful is to first give God opportunity to show us personally. However, in most cases, God will require us to take the first step by acting on His Word.

In the same way that it is impossible for God to lie, it is impossible for us to honor God without believing His Word enough to act on it. Anyone can say they believe but unless we willing to act on God's Word, then we demonstrate by our actions that we really do not believe it. I am sure that we all have heard the saying, "Actions speak louder than our words." Remember Hebrews 11:6.

HEBREWS 11:6

6 But without faith it is impossible to please [honor] Him, for he who comes to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him.

There are two main reasons why it is impossible to honor God without faith. First, if we do not believe His Word, then by default we are calling Him a

liar. Secondly, God takes pleasure and honor in rewarding and prospering all those who serve Him.

PSALMS 35:27

27 Let them shout for joy and be glad, who favor my righteous cause; and let them say continually, "Let the LORD be magnified, who has pleasure [honor] in the prosperity of His servant."

Even though God takes pleasure and honor in the rewarding and prospering those who serve Him, there is absolutely no way for us to receive any of the promises of God apart from faith in God's Word. If we do not believe God's Word then we will not be able to receive His promises, power or provision. How would we even know what His promises are, or what has been made available to us apart from His Word?
